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


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

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

#### **2014 OVERVIEW**

Looking back at 2014, the overall picture is largely positive and indicative of continued stability within the industry. In terms of hard numbers, 2014 was a strong year for both the order book and brokerage market, with new order numbers near equal to 2013, plus notable growth in the brokerage market. The health of both sectors is equally important as solid numbers of brokerage sales prevent the oversupply of existing yachts for sale from slowing new build activity. As such, 246 new orders of 24m+ yachts and 502 sales is a tangible reflection of renewed client confidence in the industry.

After growing up on the Sydney Harbour waterfront, a career in yachting was a natural progression for Captain **Angus Biffin**, and working on **Silencio** has seen him take the popular charter yacht around the world to exciting destinations.

## Word on the bridge

#### Where are you now?

Silencio is currently in Auckland, New Zealand, as she has just spent the summer season cruising here. Before that she was in Tahiti, the Galapagos Islands and the Caribbean. This is a very adventurous yacht which has been in the Pacific three times now.

#### How did you first get into yachting?

I grew up on Sydney Harbour and have always been on the water. I started sailing when I was six, in the Manly Junior class, and I've never really stopped. I sailed skiffs and racing yachts, and now have my own boat as well. I first started my yachting career as a skipper on the Sydney Harbour ferries, before moving to work on superyachts in 2007. I became a captain in 2008, and have worked all around the world on both motor and sailing yachts, joining Silencio in 2011 just after she was sold to her current owners.

#### What are the best and worst parts of your job?

The best part for me is that I love boating and being on the water, so I really do get paid to do what I love - I'm very lucky. The worst part, which I think many crew will relate to, is being away from home for so long. I'm looking forward to being able to spend time at home in Australia during the yacht's tour in the Southern Hemisphere.

#### Silencio is a hugely successful charter yachtwhat do you think makes her so popular with charter guests?

Of course, there's the boat itself, which is beautiful and spacious, but also the crew, who are definitely the most important element. We have a fantastic crew; they are rock solid. Most of them have been on board for at least two years. They all love what they do, which means that guests also have a great experience. We try to sail Silencio as much as possible, hopefully giving both crew and guests a great time. The boat is very active, and we get to race her a lot in regattas around the world - in fact we won the Perini Cup in 2013, and finished first in the New Zealand Millennium Cup earlier this year - both events were extremely proud moments for the owner, yacht and crew.

#### What is your favourite cruising ground?

That's too hard. Silencio has been to so many places over the last few years that there's almost too much choice. I would say anywhere tropical, but then that's probably biased as I haven't cruised anywhere like Antarctica or Alaska – yet.

## Silencio has already visited so many places in the world. Where are you looking forward to cruising most?

The crew and I are looking forward to spending more time cruising around the South Pacific, as there is such a diverse offering of coastlines, waters and attractions. Our owner really appreciates visiting different places and making the most of all that is on offer.

#### Where next for Silencio?

Once we leave New Zealand we will sail on to French Polynesia for the season before heading to America for the Fort Lauderdale International Boat Show. After that we will be spending time in the Caribbean and racing in the 2016 St Barths Bucket Regatta, which we are really looking forward to.

### **Taste notes**

Jazper is only 24 and at the beginning of his career as a talented chef. He has worked in some of the finest restaurants around the world, including Nobu, Maze and La Colombe.

#### How did you get into cooking?

She will kill me for saying this, but my mum is a terrible cook, so I took the reins in the kitchen from an early age. I remember being given a hand whisk when I was 12 years old, which helped me perfect 'the meringue' early in life.

#### What is your favourite part of the day?

As soon as I wake up I go to the market, usually around 7am, after which I bake the bread and pastries for the day. This part of the early morning is my treasured bit of calm before the hectic day ahead.



#### What is your favourite ingredient?

Lime. It is sharp, but sweet, and offers an unbeatable citrus freshness. Limes are particularly good with fish: I finish off my tuna, sweetcorn and chilli tartar with a generous squeeze of lime.

#### Who would you say is your culinary idol?

The South African chef Luke Dale-Roberts. I was lucky enough to work under him after winning a placement while training at Le Cordon Bleu. His inventive approach to cooking remains a strong inspiration to me.

#### Have you had many strange requests?

Boiled, blended mince for breakfast. Yes, that was pretty odd.

#### Where do you see yourself in 10 years?

I would like to own a little restaurant in Spain, perhaps on the beach, serving dishes made with the best local produce, charcuterie and wine. I would like to keep things small and simple, and impress guests with flavours - that would be awesome.



#### WHAT

- Focus on four key components: sweetness, umami (savoury taste), acidity and salt. When it comes to wine pairings, consistency is key.
- Spicy wines go with spicy foods, intense wines complement complex dishes, and fresh, light dishes and salads are best accompanied by something light and chilled.
- Always have a selection of well known classics on board.
- Remember that with a tropical climate comes a different demand.
- Provençal rosés are the top sellers when in the Caribbean.

## WHEN

- Be sure to try the local wines wherever vou cruise.
- Try wines from smaller producers that often don't make it to the export market, and cruising provides a great opportunity to discover and enrich your understanding and appreciation of wines on the advice of local connoisseurs.
- When cruising in the South of France, take advantage of your proximity to some of the finest vineyards and enjoy local Provençal cuisine with a light rosé for lunch.






- For all rosés, always choose the most recent available vintage.
- In Italy there are many more wines to discover.
   No other country has more to offer in terms of indigenous grape varieties and obscure regions.
   When cruising further east, try some of the Balkan wines.
- When in Greece, try a white wine from Santorini made from the grape assyrtiko, which is high in acid, peachy and very mineral.

# WHERE

- The perfect cellar should be dark, with the right humidity and the right temperature.
- The wine storage area should be cool, with a constant temperature between 10 and 15 degrees Celsius, and humidity between 70 and 75 per cent.
- Bottles should be stored on their sides so that the cork is kept in contact with the wine to prevent it from drying out, which leads to oxidation.
- Light wines are more likely to be rapidly affected through bad storage.
- Vibration is tricky to get around on yachts, but a good rule of thumb is to avoid keeping wine near the engine room.



that Wagner was inspired for the stage design of his opera *Parsifal*. The Romantic poets Shelley, Byron and Keats, also found inspiration from the impeccably preserved backdrop and terrace views. A sense of faded glory remains with the gardens of Villa Rufolo and Villa Cimbrone, and they are worth stepping ashore for, as is the beautiful 11th-century Duomo di Ravello.

Allow yourself time to venture inland to the ancient city of Pompeii. Buried under tiny stones and ash from Vesuvius in AD79, excavation of this well-preserved city began in 1763. Much of our knowledge of the Romans and their way of life originated from Pompeii. Ancient alleyways, once fresh with archaeologists' excavation dust, are now well-trodden pathways, yet the sheer magnitude of it remains awe inspiring.

As you cruise towards the sparkling bay and the iconic cliff face of Sorrento, the sea shimmers beneath the dormant yet still formidable Mount Vesuvius in the background. The narrow, winding cobblestoned streets of Sorrento are lined with vendors, but even when packed with tourists Sorrento still retains a certain charm. That said, it is so busy during peak summer that it is best avoided altogether. Embrace the

wraparound views of the Bay of Naples from the cliff-top terraced walkways of the Museo Correale di Terranova. For those who have worked up an appetite from walking, take a detour to the Excelsior Vittoria's Bosuet' terrace and bar, whose guestbook boasts many famous names including Richard Strauss, the Prince of Wales (who later returned as Edward VII), Sophia Loren and Luciano Pavarotti.

On day four or five, cruise across the Gulf of Salerno to the charming town of Positano. At the peak of the *Dolce Vita* era, Positano rivalled Capri for jet-set glamour and the town is still popular. Drink in the views or simply watch the passing parade of jet setters striding through the cobblestoned streets. The buzz centres around the Marina Grande, where restaurants and bars line the curve of grey shingle sand.

For the best anchorage around Positano, head to Li Galli, an archipelago of three small islets just off the coast where, according to Greek mythology, the Sirens attempted to lure Ulysses to his death. Enjoy the last rays of the evening sun on board - bliss on this convoluted stretch of coast. Early evening, step ashore to Il San Pietro di Positano and dine at the hotel's Michelin-

starred restaurant. The famous terrace is one of the best places for a sunset aperitivo. Another prime aperitivo spot can be found at Le Sirenuse's Champagne & Oyster Bar.

A gentle cruise eastwards towards Amalfi takes you passed some impressive scenery. The coastline is dominated by stunning villas and Saracen defence towers that speak of the coastlines' grand maritime past. Here you will also see the Monastero Santa Rosa. After more than 10 years' restoration work, the 17th-century former monastery has opened as a luxurious hotel with a stunning spa. Step ashore for a treatment in the stained-glass ice cave with Santa Maria Novella products.

In its heyday Amalfi was a major seaport, a great prize for the Saracen and Norman invaders whose influences are reflected in its food as well as its architecture. The town is no larger in size than neighbouring Positano or Ravello, but the whole coastline was named after it because of its history. Home to wealthy Italian merchants, sacked by Pisans and destroyed by an earthquake. Amalfi was a maritime republic rivalling Pisa, Genoa and Venice. At its core is Piazzo Duomo, from which a flight of stairs sweeps to an immense cathedral whose façade overlooks the stunning coastline below. Stretch your sea legs and take the stepped footpath that leads over the hill to Atrani, a fishing village from where you can take the tender back to vour anchorage.

Further south lie the Aeolian Islands and Sicily, ideal for an extended charter. They can easily be combined with an Amalfi coast itinerary and accessed during an overnight crossing from Amalfi to Stromboli. Created by volcanoes, two of which are still active (Stromboli and Vulcana). the Aeolian Islands have been inhabited since the fifth millennium BC. The islands have the air of a place where time has stood still, which, combined with a glittering nightlife, attracts the Milanese yachting crowd. Sicily itself lies across the Mesina Straits and is the ideal place to disembark and spend a few days ashore exploring the island's beautiful temples, colourful mosaics, vast archaeological remains, historic buildings and, of course, Mount Etna and its natural park.

Located on the southern tip of Norway, the waterfront capital Oslo is in a spectacular position overlooking the Oslofjord. Buffered by islands and woodlands, it is an ideal starting point for a cruise to Stavanger and then up to Bergen, the gateway to Norway's famed fjords. The most popular itinerary for any cruise in Norway begins in Bergen. 

For **Jan Verkerk**, owning not just one but two megayachts is his business. SEA+I talks to Verkerk on the challenges he faced transforming **Legend** into the first Alicebreaking superyacht in the world.

#### You already own the explorer vessel Sherakhan, what made you take on the extensive project of transforming Legend?

During the past few years I have had the opportunity to explore Antarctica on board Sherakhan, a superyacht that I refitted in 2005. My experiences allowed me further insight into the expertise required to cruise in such remote locations, so I wanted to create a vessel that could go anywhere in the world, but also provide the luxuries that have become standard in the superyacht industry.

# What made you choose the vessel that has now become Legend rather than starting a new build project?

Not only was Legend built by a quality Dutch shipyard, she was built as an A Class I Icebreaker – the highest rating for an ice-classed ship. She had already been transformed into an explorer superyacht by her previous owner and had been a highly successful charter yacht for a number of years. I also liked the history that accompanied Legend. She was built for the Soviet Union during the Cold War and has seen active service. This shines through her personality – that cannot be acquired in the build of a new yacht.

#### How has your experience in converting Sherakhan helped with the rebuild of Legend?

What I learnt in the years spent transforming Sherakhan into the mega yacht that she is today - and the subsequent years of owning and running her as a charter business - have proved invaluable in my attitude and knowledge for the rebuild of Legend. From creating and adapting a reliable engine room, to safety features, low noise levels, high-end air conditioning systems, vibrations, stability and even where to locate certain areas such as the galley and crew mess, are all of utmost importance when rebuilding a yacht of any size, let alone a 73.5-metre. All of these have been fine-honed on board Sherakhan and are now perfect on board Legend.

In 1995 Verkerk entered the world of supervachts with the 37-metre motor yacht Jaguar. After six successful years of charter he transferred the knowledge he had learnt to the rebuild of the 69.95-metre Sherakhan (ex Princess Margaret, an abandoned training vessel for Dutch merchant sailors). Fully SOLAS regulated and with the same papers and classifications as a passenger ship, Sherakhan is one of only a handful of superyachts that can operate as a yacht but carry up to 26 guests. Finding his niche in the market, Verkerk has taken Sherakhan to some of the world's most remote cruising grounds, including Patagonia and Antarctica. Such adventures were just the beginning of the creation of Legend.

## What have you changed in the rebuild of Legend?

Everything except the hull and main engines have been changed. Working with Icon Yachts and Diana Yacht Design, we have literally rebuilt the vessel.

#### What unique additions have you made?

Legend now boasts a fully certified helicopter platform, including refuelling systems. She also features a submarine for three people that can be used to explore the underwater world of Antarctica. In addition to the impressive submarine, will be tenders, and water toys including everything from snow scooters to wave runners, ice diving equipment, as well as equipment for the warmer waters she will explore. In addition, we have extended her stern, which now boasts a swim platform and swimming pool.

## What are your plans once she is launched later this year?

We will head to Antarctica as we have a charter booked during the Christmas period and our plans are to remain in Antarctica until the end of February. After this, the days shorten and start to close in, and the weather is less predictable, so we will work our way up South America to the Caribbean. We need to be in Greenland by May for further charters. We will stay in the Arctic region throughout the summers for charters around the Baltic before heading back to Antarctica for Christmas again. My plan at the moment is to do this year-on-year, and to follow the Polar summers.

#### And finally, what makes Legend so unique?

Legend is the only ice-breaking yacht in the world allowing guests to travel anywhere they would like. I wanted to create a luxury vessel that could make all itineraries possible and in Legend we have done this and more – anything and everything is possible on board.
